Catholic Schools Week



Each class celebrated Catholic Schools Week . This year's theme was : Communities of Service.




New Maths Curriculum



Defibrillator

We are delighted to announce that a defibrillator has kindly been donated to the school by an anonymous benefactor. This unit was supplied by Darren Forde of Eco Powered Cabinets, who kindly donated a wall-mounted bracket so that the defibrillator can be safely stored. It will be located on the wall outside of the principal's office.

This unit gives instructions through audio and images displayed on a screen. It can be used on both adults and children and has a battery life of up to five years.

We have a number of staff trained as first responders in the event of an emergency.

School Attendance

We wish to remind parents that schools are required to submit Student Absence Reports to Tusla Education Support Services (TESS) on students with serious attendance issues that have been identified during the current academic year i.e. students that have been absent from school for a cumulative total of twenty days or more.

Should your child miss more than twenty school days, the Education Welfare Officer (EWO) may come to the school to meet with you.

In extreme cases, families may be brought to court on this issue which could result in parental fines and/or imprisonment.

Extensive holidays are not acceptable to the EWO.


Poor school attendance needs to be responded to early; otherwise, as research has shown, it can lead to poorer exam results, early school leaving, unsuccessful transfer from primary and poorer life chances for children.

We are launching a school attendance campaign this term to promote good and consistent school attendance amongst pupils.
