Crimean Tatars.

Crimean Tatars are the indigenous, Muslim, Turkic-speaking people of Crimea. The Crimean Tatars had their own independent state - the Crimean Khanate from 1441 to 1783, ruled by the Giray clan, which traces its origins to Genghis Khan. This family was so respected that even the Ottoman family in Turkey revered the Giray family.

In 1783, the Crimean Khanate was annexed by the Russian Empire, which at that time was ruled by Catherine II. From then on, a policy of Russification and ousting the Crimean Tatars from Crimea was pursued. For this reason, many Crimean Tatars left Crimea, whose diasporas today live in Turkey, Romania, Bulgaria, and the USA. The period from 1783 to 1883 is usually called the "kara asyr" (black age).

With the establishment of Soviet power in Crimea, in 1921, the Autonomous Crimean Socialist Soviet Republic was created as part of the RSFSR (Russian Soviet Federative Socialist Republic), which was considered a Crimean Tatar autonomy, led by the Crimean Tatar Veli Ibraimov. But in 1928, Veli Ibraimov was shot, a repressive policy began against Crimean Tatar leaders, mosques were closed in Crimea, religious and intellectual figures were persecuted, they were tried and shot, or sent into exile. As a result, by the beginning of the Second World War, not a single mosque remained on the territory of Crimea, most of the intellectuals, managers, and religious people were killed.

In 1944, the final result of the displacement of the Crimean Tatar population from Crimea was the forced eviction of the Crimean Tatars. Crimean Tatars (mostly women and children, men fought on the WWII fronts) were forcibly taken out of Crimea in cattle cars, without food or water, mainly to Uzbekistan, Kazakhstan, Tajikistan and some regions of the RSFSR; 46.2% of Crimean Tatars died in the first year of the genocide. Despite the laws of rehabilitation after the death of Stalin, the Crimean Tatars were unable to return to their homeland until after the collapse of the Soviet Union.

Since 1989, that is 45 years after the deportation, Crimean Tatars began to actively return to Crimea. In most cases, returning to their homes or relatives was impossible since other people were already living there. Many had to rebuild their homes.

Since the 90s, Crimean Tatars have been actively organizing their way of life, improving their lives, joining society, learning and developing. From 1991 to 2014, Crimea was part of Ukraine as an Autonomous Republic of Crimea. But in 2014, the annexation and occupation of the territory of Crimea by the Russian Federation took place.

Since 2014, life for the Crimean Tatars has become tough again. Continuous house searches and arrests among the Crimean Tatar population continues to this day. Their war for life on their land continues.
